('I did not find the voice {i.e. "word"} hankari in Gə^cəz. There is the Təgrəñña verb hankärä "to cook the bread for brewing", cf. Da Bassano 1918, 56, traditionally a female job, but in monstaries, due to the rule of seclusion, it is performed by monks. It would be far-fetched to correct hankari with hangari from hangarä "carrying on the shoulders", even if according to Kidāna Wald Kəfle 1955, 480 beside "to limp" (cf. Dillmann 1865, 605) it can mean "to be a leg to someone that has not a leg" and adds "it is found in the gädl, in the tammər (miracle) and in literature.' Tedros Abraha 2015, 151 (447) n. 341)
